Try Spanish together

- Learn a few useful phrases each week.
- Use the Duolingo app to practise Spanish together.
- Have simple conversations with your child in Spanish: greetings, food, colours, hobbies and how their day was. Look up translations online
- Label everyday objects around the home with their Spanish names.
- Celebrate effort; praise your child for having a go, not just for getting every word right.



Build cultural capital

- Visit Spanish and Mexican restaurants in and around the West Midlands. Read the menu together, try something new, learn where the dish comes from and practise ordering a drink or meal in Spanish.
- Cook a Spanish or Mexican recipe at home and explore the ingredients, traditions and region behind it.
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
