
Y2 Staff

Further Information

Milk and Fruit

- Milk is available for you to buy online. If you would like your child to drink milk you will need to complete an order form and send it off or apply online. Those receiving free school meals are eligible for free milk, again, please ask at the school office.
- Children will receive a free piece of fruit at playtime.
- We recommend that your child brings a labelled water bottle everyday.

Y2 Biscuit Fund

 This is 50 pence a week collected weekly which pays for extra snack items and cooking ingredients. Any surplus money is used to fund activities to enrich the curriculum.





Keeping in touch



- Each year a school calendar will be sent home so that you are aware of key school dates. In addition to this a newsletter goes out to all parents regularly.
- The school also operates a text message service; so please make sure your mobile number is up to date.
- If your child is ill or has an appointment please ensure you inform our school office. It is important that your child regularly attends school, they have already missed a lot.

If your child is late or absent they will miss sessions, it could disrupt their settling in and mixing with friends. Having a regular attendance will help to give your child the best start in life. Your child's attendance should never fall below 90%.

National Phonics Screening

 In June, all Y1 children across the country should have completed a National Phonics
 Screening assessment. This will now take
 place this half term.



• If children fail this screening, then they will retake in June after further learning.



Y2 Standard Attainment Tests (SATs)

The tests are a tool for teachers to measure your child's performance and identify their needs as they move into key stage 2. They also allow teachers to see how your child is performing against national expected standards.

The tests can be taken any time during May and they are not strictly timed. Pupils may not even know they are taking them as many teachers will incorporate them into everyday classroom activities.

Subject	Test paper
English reading	Short text and questions Long text with separate questions
Mathematics	Arithmetic Mathematical reasoning
English grammar, punctuation and spelling (optional test)	Spelling Punctuation and grammar (including vocabulary)

Teachers will use the results from these tests, along with the work your child has done throughout the year, to help them reach their own judgements about how your child is progressing at the end of key stage 1.

These teacher assessment judgements will be reported to you by the end of the summer term.

Home learning

- Before half term, we provided you with phonics mat for all of the sounds that your child needs to know. Also a handwriting mat.
- You have and will continue to receive individual highlighted word lists to read and spell. This is updated at the end of a term.
- We will send out a home learning challenge each term for us to celebrate your child's learning at home.
