As part of your child's education at Hall Green primary, we promote personal wellbeing and development through the Personal, Social, Health and Economic (PSHE) and relationship and sex (RSE) curriculum. This gives our children the knowledge, understanding and skills to lead healthy, safe and productive lives.

For clarity, please note that despite the name of the document, sex education is not compulsory to teach at a primary level; therefore <u>WE DO NOT</u> include this topic in our curriculum.

You may have been aware that the Department for Education announced changes to the relationships and sex education for schools in the UK that came into effect in the summer term, 2021. All schools were required to comply with the updated changes. The statutory guidance can be found here Health_Education.pdf

We have recently reviewed our PSHE/ RSE policy and updated our curriculum scheme so we can be sure our provision is relevant for our pupils and covers a range of topics relating to physical and mental health, wellbeing and safeguarding. Our provision takes into account our children's ages, their religious and cultural backgrounds and any special educational needs they might have.
