



Hall Green Primary School PE & Sports Premium funding

2015/2016

The PE & Sports Premium Grant is a specific Government funding allocated to schools in order to develop a 'sporting legacy; in the wake of the 2012 Olympics. The level of funding provided to schools is based upon pupil numbers recorded in the annual school census.

At Hall Green Primary School we are dedicated to providing an enriched sports curriculum and we pride ourselves on the range of opportunities that are provide for our children to enable them to participate in a vast range of physical activities, not only as part of curriculum lessons but also by use of after school clubs and tournaments.

This academic year we received approximately £9,000. As a school we will use this funding to:

- Develop the quality and consistency of teaching and learning in PE across the school through employment of a specific sports coach
- Increase the opportunity for children across the school to compete in competitions and tournaments
- Give all children, including the least active, the opportunity to take part in a range of physical activities during school hours and out of hours that promote leading an active and healthy lifestyle.
- Give all children including SEN and GT pupil the opportunity to develop key skills through specific PE intervention

These priorities have been allocated for PE & Sports funding based on the findings from last year's funding. The information below provides a summary of how the PE & Sports Premium Grant for 2014/15 was spent and the outcome of each focus is also provided.
